1. Data.

- a. Date of Mission - 7 May 1944.
- b. Primary Targets - Osnabruck - 96th CBW, 2nd CBW "A", 14th CBW.
Munster - 2nd CBW "B", 20th CBW.
- c. Secondary Target - None.
- d. East Resort Target - None.

2. Narrative.

- a. 325 aircraft from four Combat Wings were dispatched to attack visually, or through the use of PFF, the cities of Osnabruck and Munster. Four Groups of P-47s provided fighter support.
- b. Group and Wing assemblies were accomplished without incident. Some difficulty was experienced at the Division assembly line with the 2nd Combat Wing "B" taking the lead on departure from the English coast. The route was flown generally as briefed.
- c. All units bombed in Wang formation on PFF with unobserved results. Due to mistaken identity on the part of the Mickey operators, the 14th Combat Wing bombed Munster instead of Osnabruck and the 2nd Combat Wing "B" attacked Osnabruck instead of Munster.
- d. Moderate to intense accurate flak was encountered over Munster and Osnabruck. Some crews reported seeing smoke bombs, which imitated our PFF flares, but they were not as bright and did not leave as large a smoke trail. Heavy gunfire was reported over the northern Ruhr and from barges off the Dutch coast. No enemy aircraft were seen and fighter support was good. Losses were one to flak and none to enemy aircraft. Claims are nil.

- The assigned primary targets for this mission were Osnabruck and Munster, Germany.
- Osnabruck was attacked by six Groups and Munster was attacked by five Groups. Bombing was done by PTF through 10/10 undercast in Combat Wing formation.
- Four A/C failed to bomb due to the bombardier not seeing the PTF smoke markers. One A/C did not bomb due to the bomb bay doors failing to open. Six A/C did not bomb due to rack malfunctions.

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire.

- a. The 96th Wing encountered a fixed barrage at Osnabruck which appears to have been fairly accurately placed for the 466th and 467th Groups, but was inaccurate for the 458th Group. The 44th, 509th and 455th Groups all encountered inaccurate fixed barrages over the target.
- b. The 392nd Group, which led the attack on Hanster, encountered intense and fairly accurate predictor control "unseen" fire over the target. The 445th Group, following closely behind, encountered inaccurate predictor control "unseen" fire which was too low. All Groups in the 20th Wing encountered moderate to intense inaccurate fire over the target which was mainly in the form of a fixed barrage although some predictor control fire was also reported.
- c. Heavy gunfire was encountered on route from the northern Ruhr, and from barges off the Dutch coast.
- d. Several rockets were seen at Osnabruck.
- e. At Hanster, white objects resembling tennis balls were observed coming up from the ground leaving a slight smoke trail and bursting into a sort of flare.

5. Communications.

- a. VHF R/T communication was excellent, with contacts maintained to enemy coast, and interplane messages intercepted beyond that point. W/T communication failed for a short distance in the vicinity of Control Point three, apparently due to a noticeable skip effect, since communication was restored further along the route. Pathfinder equipment (H2K) was used in each Combat Wing lead aircraft with fair results. Some technical difficulty was experienced in 14th and 2nd Combat Wings; however, recognition of landmarks and target extended to a maximum of 100 miles in one aircraft. Two Groups reported "Window" discharge very effective in reducing accuracy of Flak.
