SUBJECT: Tactical Report of Mission, 21 May 1944

TO : Commanding General, Eighth Air Force, AAF 101, APO 634

1. Data.

- a. Date of Mission - 21 May 1944
- b. Primary Target - Siracourt - Noball
- c. Secondary Target - None
- d. Last Resort Target - None
- e. Units Participating - 14th CBW (44th, 392nd, 492nd BG)
 96th CBW (458th, 467th, 466th BG)

2. Narrative.

- a. Nine twelve-ship Squadrons from the 14th and 96th Wings, each led by a GH ship, were dispatched to attack the Noball installation at Siracourt. One Group of P-47's provided fighter support.
- b. Assemblies were accomplished without incident and the route was flown as briefed.
- c. All Squadrons bombed by GH through 8 to 10/10 cloud with unobserved results. GH equipment performed efficiently.
- d. No anti-aircraft fire was reported in the target area but a few rockets were seen. Meager inaccurate gunfire was encountered enroute at Lille and Hesdin. No enemy aircraft were seen and fighter support was excellent. Losses and claims were nil.

1. The assigned primary target for this special mission was Siracourt, France.
2. The target was attacked by nine Squadrons, each Squadron led by a GH A/C bombing through 8/10 to 10/10 undercast.
3. Two A/C failed to bomb due to bomb bay door malfunctions, another A/C did not bomb due to rack malfunction and one A/C did not bomb due to electrical failure and selector rod malfunction.
4. The results of bombing of three Squadrons was fair but due to 10/10 undercast, the results of the remaining six Squadrons was unobserved.

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire.

a. "Noball" No. 7

- (1) No AA fire was encountered in the target area, but a few rockets were seen here.
- (2) Meager and inaccurate gunfire was encountered on route at Lille and Hesdin.

5. Communications.

a. W/T and R/T channels were very satisfactory. Three aircraft reported radio compass trouble on the frequency of buncher beacon 15. All aircraft discharged "window" in the target area. The initial operational use of "Carpet-blinker" RCM equipment was made. Two aircraft were dispatched from the 44th Bomb Group. Operators reported apparently successful jamming on several enemy radar stations. GH equipment was used for bombing through overcast. All sets performed efficiently.
