1. Data.

a. Date of Mission - 24 May 1944

b. Primary Targets:

Orly Airfield - 2nd and 20th Combat Wings  
 Melun Airfield - 96th and 14th "A" and 14th "B" Combat Wings

c. Secondary Target:

Creil Airfield - All Combat Wings

d. Last Resort Target - Any airdrome in occupied territory not dangerously close to built-up area.

e. Units Participating - 2nd CEW (445th, 453rd, 389th BG)  
 20th CEW (93rd, 446th, 448th BG)  
 96th CEW (466th, 467th, 458th BG)  
 14th "A" CEW (392nd, 492nd BG)  
 14th "B" CEW (44th, 492nd BG)

2. Narrative.

a. 386 aircraft from four Combat Wings were dispatched to visually attack the airdromes at Orly and Melun. Five Groups of P-47's provided fighter support.

b. Assemblies were accomplished without incident and the route was flown generally as briefed.

c. Three Groups attacked the A/D with excellent results and six Groups the A/D at Melun with good results. One Group was unable to pick out the assigned MPI due to haze and bombed the secondary target, the A/D at Creil, with good results. One Squadron did not release on the primary target due to danger of dropping on planes beneath and failed to attack the secondary because of a bomb-sight malfunction.

d. Moderate accurate flak was encountered at Orly A/D and at Melun A/D. Heavy gunfire was encountered at Nogent, Neufchatel, Ascheres le Marche, and Meaux; meager gunfire was encountered at Beauvais, Orleans-Ericy, Chateaudun, Abancourt area, southeast of Caen, southeast of Dieppe, Campigne and Fontainebleau. No enemy aircraft were seen and fighter support was good throughout the mission. Losses and claims were nil.

1. The assigned primary targets for this mission were the A/D at Orly and Melun, France.
2. Orly was attacked by 3 Groups bombing by Squadrons and Melun was attacked by 6 Groups bombing by Squadrons.
3. One Group did not bomb the primary due to haze and smoke but attacked the secondary. One Squadron did not bomb due to a bombsight malfunction. There were two cases of accidental releases before reaching the target. On one, the lead A/C accidentally released and 3 A/C dropped. On the other, one A/C accidentally released and 6 other A/C dropped on this release. One A/C failed to bomb due to a rack malfunction.
4. The results of bombing at Orly A/D were good and results at Melun were good.

3. Anti-Aircraft Fire.

- a. All Groups encountered moderate and fairly accurate predictor control fire during the bombing run on Orly A/F, which was almost certainly coming from Bretigny. Gunfire was meager in the target area and became more intense while the formations were turning away from bombing. It seems probable that there were no guns in the target area, but crews estimated that they were engaged by 12 to 16 guns from the South East side of Paris whilst they were leaving the target.
- b. No Gunfire was encountered at Melun A/F.
- c. The 93rd Group, which attacked Oreil A/F, approached the target from the South East and encountered no Gunfire. However, shortly after leaving the target area meager Heavy Gunfire was encountered which was believed to have come from the vicinity of Clermont.
- d. Moderate Heavy Gunfire was encountered on route at Nogent, Neufchatel, Ascheres le Marche and Meaux.
- e. Meager Heavy Gunfire was encountered on route at Beauvais, Orleans/Bricy, Chateaudun, Abancourt Area, SE of Caen, SE of Dieppe, Compiagne, and Fontainebleau.

5. Communications.

- a. W/T and R/T channels were satisfactory although excessive interference was reported on the base HF/DF channels of two groups. "Window" was discharged by designated groups in the target area. Carpet-blinker equipment was used with apparent success. Operators reported enemy radars changing frequencies when jammed, reverting from tracking to searching and in some cases enemy radar transmissions were shut off completely.
